Test Taking Tips for the CSET Math Subtest /1

1. Read Questions Carefully

2. Eliminate Wrong Choices Quickly

3. Keep an Eye on the Clock

Don't spend more than 45 seconds on a single question. If you're stuck, move on and return if time permits.

4. Double Check Your Work

If you finish early, review your answers, especially those you were uncertain about.

Practice relaxation techniques—deep breathing, positive visualization—to reduce test anxiety.
