= 7.5. Place the decimal point in the quotient directly above where it was in the dividend.

5. Round or Express the Result Appropriately

6. Verify the Answer in Context

Encourage students to double check the answer by multiplying the quotient by the divisor. If the product matches the dividend (within the required precision), the answer is correct.

Sample Problems to Practice Decimal Division

7. Cost Per Unit: A factory produces 250.5 units of a product for a total cost of \$1,125. What is the cost per unit? Round to the nearest cent.
8. Time Calculation: A runner completes 3.6 kilometers in 15.3 minutes. What is the runner’s speed in kilometers per minute? Then, convert that speed to kilometers per hour.
9. Budget Allocation: A teacher has a budget of \$3.75 for each student. If there are 42.5 students, how much total budget is needed? If the teacher only has \$150, how many students can be accommodated?
10. Complex Scenario: A bakery sells cupcakes in boxes of 4.5. The total cost for 12 boxes is \$108. If the bakery offers a 20% discount on the total price, what is the new cost? Then, how many cupcakes can the bakery buy for \$50 at the discounted rate?

After each problem, provide a space for students to write their answer, show working, and reflect on the reasoning.
