Design Ideas & Sample Plans

Connect the panels using glue and, if necessary, additional fasteners such as small nails or staples (for thicker cardboard). Let the glue dry fully before moving the piece.

Step 6: Attach the Top or Surface

Place the tabletop or main surface onto the frame. Use a generous amount of glue along the edges and press firmly to ensure a solid connection. If the tabletop is large, consider adding a center support strip to prevent sagging.

Step 7: Finish the Edges

Smooth any rough edges with sandpaper or an emery board. This step prevents splinters and gives a cleaner look. For a polished finish, apply a thin coat of white glue or a clear sealant.

Apply paint or decorative paper to the exterior surfaces. Acrylic paint works well on cardboard; apply two coats for even coverage. For a more rustic look, use a fabric wrap or cork panels.
