Blocking Numbers on iPhone

Apple's iOS offers a built in feature that allows you to block any phone number directly from the phone app or contacts. The process is simple and works across all iPhone models running iOS 7 or later.

Step by Step: How to Block a Number on iPhone

1. Open the Phone app. Tap the Recents tab to view your recent calls.
2. Find the number. Swipe left on the call you want to block and tap Info (the "i" icon).
3. Scroll down. At the bottom of the screen, tap Block this Caller.
4. Confirm the block. Tap Block Contact. The number is now added to your blocked list.

You can also block a number from your **Contacts** list:

1. Open the Contacts app.
2. Tap the contact you wish to block.
3. Scroll to the bottom and tap Block this Caller.

Managing Your Blocked List

To view or edit the list of blocked numbers:

1. Open Settings.
2. Scroll down and tap Phone.
3. Select Call Blocking & Identification. Here, you'll see all blocked numbers and can remove any by swiping left and tapping Unblock.

Blocked callers can still send you text messages, but you can block SMS from the same settings menu by tapping **Messages** and then **Unknown & Spam**.

Additional Tips for iPhone Users

- Use Do Not Disturb. Turn on Do Not Disturb mode to silence calls from unknown numbers while still allowing calls from your contacts.
- Enable Silence Unknown Callers. In iOS 13 and later, you can automatically silence calls from numbers not in your contacts.
- Report Spam. When you block a spam number, iOS may offer to report it to the carrier for further action.

Blocking Numbers on Android

Android offers several ways to block numbers, though the exact steps vary slightly depending on the device manufacturer and Android version. Below are the most common methods.

Using the Default Phone App

1. Open the Phone app.
2. Tap the Recents tab.
3. Long press the number or contact you wish to block.
4. Tap Block number or Block contact.
5. Confirm by tapping Block.

Some Android phones may use a different terminology, such as “Add to block list” or “Block caller.” The principle remains the same.

Blocking Numbers from Settings (All Android Devices)

1. Open Settings.
2. Tap Apps & notifications.
3. Tap Phone.
4. Select Caller ID & spam.
5. Enable Block unknown callers and/or add specific numbers to the block list.

Manufacturer Specific Features

- Samsung: Samsung's Phone app has a built in “Block number” option. Additionally, the “Call Blocking” app on Samsung devices allows you to set rules and block entire area codes.
- Google Pixel: The Google Phone app includes a “Block numbers” feature under the “Settings” menu. It also offers a “Do Not Disturb” mode that can silence calls from unknown numbers.
- Huawei: Huawei's Phone app provides a “Block caller” option and a “Call screening” feature that can automatically block spam calls.

Using Third Party Call Blocking Apps

For more advanced filtering, Android users can install third party apps. Popular options include:

- Truecaller – identifies unknown numbers and blocks spam.
- Hiya – offers real time spam detection and blocking.

- RoboKiller – blocks robocalls and telemarketers using AI.

These apps often provide a database of known spam numbers and can block entire categories of callers.

Blocking Numbers on Other Devices and Platforms

Windows Phone

Windows Phone users can block numbers by going to Settings > Phone > Call blocking. From there, you can add numbers manually or block entire area codes.

Google Voice

Google Voice offers a robust call filtering system. To block a number:

1. Open the Google Voice app or website.
2. Click the Settings gear icon.
3. Select Calls and then Block numbers.
4. Enter the number you wish to block and confirm.

Google Voice also allows you to set up “Call Screening” and “Do Not Disturb” modes for added protection.

Carrier Level Call Blocking and Services

Many carriers provide call blocking services that operate at the network level. These can be more effective for large scale spam and robocalls.

Verizon

- Verizon’s Call Filter app can block unwanted numbers and identify spam.
- Verizon also offers a Do Not Call registry that you can register with to reduce telemarketing calls.

AT&T

- AT&T’s Call Protect service blocks spam and robocalls.
- Use the AT&T Call Protection app for real time blocking.

T Mobile

- T Mobile offers Call Blocking and Do Not Disturb features.
- Customers can also register with the National Do Not Call Registry through T Mobile.

How to Access Carrier Blocking Services

1. Contact your carrier’s customer service line.
2. Ask for the call blocking or spam filtering service.
3. Follow the instructions to enroll and set your preferences.

Carrier services are often free or included in your plan, but some carriers may charge a small monthly fee for advanced filtering.

Third Party Call Blocking Apps

When built in features are insufficient, third party apps can offer deeper protection. Below are the most popular choices and how they work.

Truecaller

Truecaller uses a massive community driven database to identify spam numbers. It also offers features like:

- Caller ID and contact identification.
- Spam detection and automatic blocking.
- Call blocking rules based on area code or country.

Hiya

Hiya provides real time caller identification and spam detection. Its key features include:

- Automatic call blocking for known spam numbers.
- Contact and call history management.

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
