Tolkien Estate Deluxe Edition: **440 pages**. The map and foreword significantly increase the page count.

Digital Formats

eBook Versions

eBook formats (Kindle, EPUB, PDF) typically do not have a fixed page count because the text can reflow based on device settings. However, the **PDF version** often mirrors the layout of the printed edition, so its page count is usually identical to the corresponding print version.

Audio Book Versions

Audio books measure length in hours, not pages. For reference, the standard audiobook version of The Hobbit runs about **10 hours** in a single narrator format.
