Paper cones can be flimsy, especially if you plan to wear the hat. To reinforce it, cut a strip of paper about 2 cm wide and 15 cm long. Fold this strip in half and glue it to the inside of the cone, aligning the fold along the center of the hat. This adds structural support without adding bulk.

Step 4: Add the Brim

Measure the circumference of the hat's top—around 20 cm. Cut a strip of paper or cardstock that's slightly longer (about 22 /cm) and a width of 2 /cm. Fold the strip into a circle and glue it around the top of the cone. The brim should sit just below the peak of the hat, giving it a classic elf silhouette.

Step 5: Decorate Your Elf Hat

Now's the fun part! Use felt to create a pom pom that sits at the tip of the hat. Cut a small circle from felt, roll it into a tight ball, and secure it with a dab of glue. Alternatively, glue a pre-made pom pom or a small piece of pom pom glue to the tip.

For added sparkle, sprinkle glitter along the brim or attach a small ribbon that drapes down the front. If you're aiming for a more elaborate look, glue a tiny bell or a faux fur trim around the brim.

Step 6: Secure the Hat on Your Head

Place a small elastic band or a headband inside the hat to keep it in place. If you're wearing the hat for a photo shoot or a costume event, you can also use a discreet pin at the back to hold it firmly. Ensure the hat sits comfortably and that the brim doesn't obstruct your vision.
