- TV: 1234, 5678, 9012
- Receiver/Amplifier: 3456, 7890, 2345
- Set Top Box: 4567, 8901, 6789
- DVD Player: 5678, 1235, 4561
- Blu ray Player: 6789, 2346, 5679

Programming an RCA Remote on a Universal Remote

If you prefer a single remote to control all your RCA devices, a universal remote is a great option. Many popular models (such as Logitech Harmony, Philips RC5, and GE 3370) support RCA devices. Follow these tailored steps:

1. Insert the Universal Remote's Batteries – Ensure the remote's power indicator is on.
